





WELLINGTON INTERNATIONAL DREAMS BIG with Plans for a New Equestrian Paradise

ellington International, the world-renowned equestrian venue located in the Village of Wellington, recently rebranded and changed its name from the former moniker of Palm Beach International Equestrian Center. Known as one of the world's premier destinations for equestrian enthusiasts, the venue grew to its current stature under the leadership of Mark Bellissimo and Wellington Equestrian Partners starting in the early 2000s but changed hands in 2021 and is now entering its next chapter with Global Equestrian Group at the helm. The Denmark-based new blood, along with its private equity partner Waterland, has impressive dreams for its first foray into the American market, but has already started to prove that it has the willpower, resources, and commitment to transform the existing equestrian haven into something even more remarkable in the coming years.

"The Winter Equestrian Festival started here in Wellington in 1974, made its home here at our facility in 1989, and has continued its unprecedented growth ever since, along with the entire Village of Wellington and Palm Beach County, to become the pinnacle of equestrian competition throughout North America and beyond," commented Michael Stone, President of Equestrian Sport Productions, which operates Wellington International. "We take great pride in our designation as the Winter Equestrian Capital of the World and have enjoyed welcoming thousands of exhibitors and visitors each year to experience the joys and thrills of the sport. Now with the support of the Global Equestrian Group, we will be able to further expand upon that foundation to create an equestrian facility that rivals the best in the world."

The first step in the long-term plan for the venue was to change the name and branding of the venue to represent its commitment to entering the next era. For years, the proximity and association with Palm Beach benefitted the equestrian property as it aimed to attract customers and spectators that frequented the island, but the decision to remove Palm Beach from the name was a conscious one by the management team.

"When the Palm Beach International Equestrian Center was first founded, it relied on the reputation of the popular tourist destination of Palm Beach to bring participants and fans out to the horse shows," remarked Vaneli Bojkova, Executive Vice President of Equestrian Sport Productions. "Now that the venue and community of Wellington have become their own lifestyle, sport, and tourist destination not just nationally but internationally, we felt strongly that the town name should stand on its own, thus the new name of Wellington International."

With more visibility and increased capital comes raised expectations, and the management team

behind Wellington International is intent on living up to the hype. As one of the newest members of the Global Equestrian Group portfolio, the venue is in good company along with some of the most well-known equestrian brands in the industry, such as Helgstrand Dressage, Beerbaum Stables, Riesenbeck International, and a host of other names that would cause any horse lover's ears to perk up. With a self-proclaimed vision "to become the world's leading equestrian company," Global Equestrian Group is certainly setting the bar high, but early looks at the company's five-year plan for Wellington International are lofty enough to suggest that big things are in store for its South Florida property, and with it the broader community of Wellington.

"We have spent the first year of our ownership of Wellington International understanding how things have been done in the past and recognizing the areas in which we can improve. These insights have helped us to formulate a grand vision for the venue, and we are thrilled to be in the early stages of our long-term plan," said Andreas Helgstrand, Founder and CEO of Global Equestrian Group. "Visitors to the 2023 Winter Equestrian Festival will notice upgrades to the permanent stabling, the hospitality spaces, and the riding arenas, but these items are just the first baby steps in a much larger and more ambitious strategy."

The full scope of the five-year plan won't be fully realized until at least 2026, but early reports of the construction plans are a horse lover's dream and will surely catapult the venue into the next tier of equestrian



excellence, a Disney Worldlike level that arguably only a few equine sport venues across the globe have successfully reached. Proposed facility blueprints include doubling the acreage of the facility's land, which would allow for a second equestrian center, complete with a stadium, grass derby field, and extensive amenities for guests, to be built directly beside the original property. The size and capabilities of the venues, which could be used independently of each other or as one unit,

would be able to comfortably host hunter/jumper and dressage shows concurrently. Additionally, the impressive early renderings showcase modern spaces for shopping and dining, plus enhanced opportunities for hospitality offerings and VIP luxury, offering a comfortable experience for everyone, even those with no horse experience.

For such a massive undertaking, the executive teams have hired experienced contractors, architects, and other advisors to spearhead the planning, but the day-to-day operations of the existing facility and events, which sits at close to 100 acres and number more than 40 weeks per year, are overseen by a local team and supported by the Global Equestrian Group team in Europe. Wellington International's Florida-based staff is composed of about 30 fulltime staff members, split between two offices in town; one on the showgrounds for the horse show operations team and another just down the street for the back-office team.

Though the organization does big business and is

an international attraction, the mid-size team behind the success still manages to foster a small-business feel, with all the employees knowing each other and every department chipping in where needed to benefit the group. Wellington International's team is not anonymous numbers, but rather integral employees whose skills, passions, and ideas all collaborate to propel the company and its events forward. Now with Global Equestrian Group behind this small but mighty bunch, the sky seems to be the limit for Wellington International as it aims to further extend its reputation as the most noteworthy equestrian venue in the United States.

As the team at Wellington International looks to the future and makes plans to better serve its participants and community, they are committed to setting new standards for the venue, as well as equestrian sport, guest experiences, entertainment, and innovation. So flip forward in your calendars to 2026 and set a reminder to check in on Wellington International, because exciting changes are coming for this storied venue and the community that supports it. W









THE SPECTATOR'S GUIDE to Equestrian Competition



GRAND PRIX SHOW JUMPING

Jumping is one of the three Olympic equestrian sports, along with Dressage and Eventing. As in all equestrian sports, men and women compete on equal terms. The Olympic sport of Grand Prix show jumping is the highest and most challenging level of jumping competition. Men and women compete over a set course of obstacles that can be as tall as 1.60 meters (5.25 feet) in height. They must clear all of the fences without knocking down a pole in order to return for the second round, also known as the "jump-off," and be the fastest with the least faults to win.

Guide to Scoring in Show Jumping

Penalties in show jumping competitions are referred to as "faults." Knocking down a rail or a pole on a jump is 4 faults, as is putting a foot in the water jump or the first refusal. In all jumper classes, falls and going off-course result in elimination, as does a second refusal.

Show Jumping Faults and Penalties

- Knocking over a jump 4 faults
- Refusing a jump4 faults
- Two refusals.....Eliminated
- Rider falls offEliminated
- Over the time allowed. . . . faults for every second over the time

HUNTERS

Hunt seat competitions are based upon elegant traditions arising from the foxhunt. Hunters differ from jumpers because they are judged on the style, movement, and technical proficiency of the horse and rider within the constraints of the set course design. Hunters should display jumping ability, manners, style, an even pace, and quality.



CONCOURS DE SAUT INTERNATIONAL: CSI

CSI, an acronym for Concours de Saut International, a show jumping competition recognized by the FEI. As CSI-W, there are World Cup qualifying or World Cup classes at the show, as CSIO there are Olympic qualifying or Olympic classes at the show and designate a team competition.

FEI

Fédération Equestre Internationale is the international governing body for all Olympic equestrian disciplines based in Lausanne, Switzerland.

EQUITATION

Equitation competition is offered for junior and amateur riders and is judged based on the style and form of the rider. Horses are not judged in this discipline, but successful riders will ensure that their horses are well behaved. Riders can be judged over fences or on the flat.




DRESSAGE

Dressage is a competitive equestrian sport, defined by the International Equestrian Federation (FEI) as "the highest expression of horse training." The rider will be relaxed and appear effort-free while the horse willingly performs the requested movement. In modern dressage competition, successful training at the various levels is demonstrated through the performance of "tests," prescribed series of movements ridden within a standard arena. Dressage is considered the most artistic of the equestrian sports and can be traced back centuries. The Freestyle is choreographed and performed to music.



PARA DRESSAGE

Para Dressage is the sport of Dressage, the highest expression of horse training, for Athletes with an impairment. Conducted under the same basic rules, but with Athletes classified according to the level of their impairment, the horse has to perform at a walk, trot, and canter, and all tests are ridden from memory and follow a prescribed pattern of movements. The only exception is the Freestyle which is specifically choreographed for each horse and is performed to music. Para Dressage is the only Equestrian discipline included in the Paralympic Games, where it has been a regular fixture since 1996. The Paralympic Games are the second largest sporting event in the world after the Olympic Games, and are contested immediately after the Olympic Games in the same city and at the same venue. W


to nearly double its original size and includes everything needed for dressage and jumpers to train with success.

Family Spotlight: THE KOROTKINS

s the head of Castlewood Farm, Alan and his wife Kirsty have established Castlewood as a premier facility renowned for its excellent training, instruction, and sales in the heart of Wellington. Along with training riders of all levels at Castlewood, the Korotkins have also trained two of their three children



and watched them move up through the equestrian ranks. Their youngest, Carsyn, is currently competing in the pony hunter divisions and showed at the USEF Pony Finals, while Tanner has already made a

name for himself as a young professional grand prix rider and has represented the U.S. on Nations Cup teams. Keep reading to learn how Alan and Kirsty got their start in riding, his greatest accomplishment as a rider, how Wellington has changed over the years, and more!

How did you and your wife Kirsty get your start in riding?

I started riding in New York when I was about 12. I rode in New York for a while before I started riding with Bill Cooney, Frank Madden, and George Morris and did the equitation with them and got ribbons in the finals. After that, I started working for Carol Thompson in Colts Neck, New Jersey, and worked my way up to the grand prix level. When I took a job with Top Brass Farm, I moved to Florida and opened up my own business the following year, in 1991.

My wife, Kirsty, had a completely different trajectory than me. She was born in England and moved around with her family a lot. Eventually, they ended up in Chicago, where she rode with Laura Stern. She did the juniors with her and the Medal/Maclay and the jumpers. In 1996, she came down to Florida, and that's when we met. After a few years of riding with me, she decided to get her professional status.

Why did you decide to start your business in Wellington?

I realized early on that it made more sense to be based in Wellington and travel in the summer, and it has really paid off. Wellington was starting to take off, and we were spending six months out of the year competing during the entire circuit. Now, that's what most people do, but I was one of the first people from the north to come and set roots here before I had kids, and it just worked out perfectly. I think it has been the absolute best place to live.

The biggest advantage to having your own barn in Wellington is not having to bring all the horses down and stable them at the showgrounds. Because my farm is here, I can have 45 horses and take 20 over to the show at a time and move back and forth. People now are renting barns and doing that, but I've been doing it for a long time.





I'm also able to sell a lot of horses during the season. It's like having a warehouse and I have horses for all levels, so I can cater to a variety of clients. Most people don't have a children's hunter here just to sell it because of the costs related to shipping and stabling it here for the season, but because I live here, I do.

How has the venue changed over the years since you first started showing here?

It's funny because when I was a junior, the show was still over at Palm Beach Polo. We used to walk across South Shore to get to the stabling, and then they built the new facility in 1989 or 1990, and the whole thing just flourished from there. The kind of growth that Wellington has had is amazing. I remember once, as a kid, I showed up to one of the open jumper classes with Rodney Jenkins, Bert Mutch, and all of these famous riders and it was just a casual afternoon, whereas now it's a big to-do.

What has been your greatest accomplishment as a rider?

It's hard to pinpoint one thing. I have about 100 top grand prix placings from over the years, with my major one in Vermont years ago. I also won a team gold medal at the 1990 Olympic Festival, which is similar to the Young Riders championships today.

What is it like raising your kids in Wellington and watching them progress in their equestrian careers?

For the kids, having all of the shows here in Wellington has been fantastic. I've been able to get them mounted on good horses, and I have my business here. Watching my kids come along in their equestrian careers has been incredibly rewarding. Carsyn is competing in the small ponies, and Tanner has come pretty far. Hopefully, Carsyn will follow in that light as well.

The fact that every Saturday night class feels like a special moment gives riders a valuable experience that you can't get in many places to prepare them for big-stage events. I remember when Tanner competed under the lights for the first time, and people were talking about it. Before, you had to go to Aachen to feel like it was Aachen, but Wellington has provided that sharpness and international feel and the importance of the class by having the night classes. W



4 KEYS TO LIMITING LAMENESS Mobility matters, so help keep your horse moving with healthy joints and smart healthcare.

ameness. A dreaded word. Uttering it means that your horse may be out of commission. Determining the cause can be challenging, which means treatment—and recovery—can be a long process.

But it doesn't have to be this way. These four keys to proactive care and communication with your veterinarian can help keep lameness from sidelining your horse and ruining your ride.

1. Commit to regular soundness exams

Prevention is the best treatment. While there's no foolproof way to stop lameness from happening, there are ways to reduce its effects. Leading veterinarians, including Kent Allen, DVM, owner of Virginia Equine Imaging and a founder of the International Society of Equine Locomotor Pathology, agree that regular soundness exams are one of the best ways to catch problems before they've negativelyimpacted your horse. "Bringing the horse in twice a year for a lameness exam is what you can do that will undoubtedly prolong this horse's athletic life. We can detect arthritis early and come up with a rational plan," Dr. Allen said.

During a soundness examination, your veterinarian may:

- Observe your horse walking, trotting and cantering
- Examine your horse's back, neck and joints
- Complete a nerve block by using local anesthetic to temporarily desensitize certain areas of thelimb to help identify potential issues
- Complete X-rays, possibly sharing hoof images with your farrier to help ensure ongoing propershoeing

By establishing your horse's "normal," you and your veterinarian will be able to identify potential issues earlier. This is especially important because lameness may not always be obvious. In early stages, subtle changes in gait, performance or willingness to work may be the only indiciation.¹

2. Keep your veterinarian in the know

"Because early signs of lameness can be difficult to spot, it's smart to consider your veterinarian your first source of lameness information. Similarly, your veterinarian relies on you for information. So be sure to share observations about how your horse is moving,"says Zach Loppnow, DVM, an equine surgery resident at Steinbeck Country Equine Clinics in California. After all, he says, you know your horse better than anyone else. "Take note of when it's not doing what you normally expect it to do. Take note of how that's changed, what it's doing differently—because the more time-based information you can give me on when it's doing things and what it's doing, the better I can diagnose what may be going on," Dr. Loppnow said.

3. Agree to diagnostics, especially for DJD

Speaking of diagnosis, communication becomes even more important if you suspect your horse is dealing with a lameness issue. When your horse is being evaluated for lameness, your veterinarian will ask you a number of questions ranging from your horse's routine exercise to diet and supplement use to changes in housing to other therapies your horse is receiving. Your veterinarian will also ask you to describe any past lameness your horse has experienced. All this information is critical to supporting the diagnostic procedures, which may include radiographs, nerve blocks, ultrasound and more, depending on the suspected issue.

Degenerative joint disease (DJD), also called arthritis, is often to blame for lameness. In fact, DJD causes up to 60 percent of lameness in horses.² DJD is characterized by progressive deterioration of articular cartilage, along with changes in the bone and soft tissues of the joint.¹ If left untreated, DJD continues to get worse. Diagnosing DJD allows you and your veterinarian to begin treatment early, because once cartilage wears away completely, it cannot be restored.

4. Know product differences

To help overcome lameness and get your horse moving again, veterinarians will recommend a treatment plan tailored to the location, severity and cause of the lameness, plus your horse's type and level of work. When DJD is diagnosed as the cause, using therapies to both reduce the symptoms (lameness) and slow disease progression is ideal.

Successfully managing DJD may require a combination of therapies, such as FDA-approved drugs, complementary modalities and biologics. The many joint therapies vary widely in effectiveness, safety and cost, so it's important to talk with your veterinarian about the differences. Working together to choose what's right for your horse can make a real difference in long-term health.

These product categories are some of the most wellknown (and potentially misunderstood):

Why is lameness diagnosis so challenging?

While some breeds and horses in specific disciplines are more likely to experience lameness in certain joints, it can occur in a horse of any breed, performing any type of work at any level, and at any time in life.1 Horses can become lame from a variety of causes, and it can be as subtle as a shortening of stride length or so extreme that the horse will not put weight on the affected limb. Lameness may be isolated to one limb, involve multiple limbs or may originate from other areas of the body, such as the spine.

Therefore, diagnosis requires a veterinarian to possess a firm understanding of equine anatomy, conformation and gait analysis, as well as skill in the use of various diagnostic procedures and tools. Reaching an accurate diagnosis is critical to determining an effective treatment plan, which the veterinarian will recommend based on the location, severity and cause of the lameness, plus the type and level of the horse's work.

STARS WILL SHINE At 2023 Adequan® Global Dressage Festival

The 12th edition of the Adequan[®] Global Dressage Festival (AGDF) will feature the best competition in North America as riders from across the country and around the world return to Equestrian Village in Wellington, Florida, from January 11–March 31, 2023.

This year's schedule includes 10 weeks of competition, including seven Fédération International Equestre (FEI) CDI-rated shows, for professionals, amateurs, under 25, young rider, junior, and pony competitors.

"This year's show promises to be another spectacular circuit," said ADGF Director of Sport, Thomas Baur. "We expect many international entries that will be aiming for World Cup qualification, as well as preparing for the Pan American Games, European Championships, and qualifiers for the 2024 Paris Olympic and Paralympic Games. The Lövsta Future Challenge for young grand prix horses has been an incredible success, and we expect that division to continue to grow, as well as the Future Challenge Young Horse Prix St. Georges Series."

The season's schedule features three CDI-W shows, two CDI4* events and one CDI5*, as well as a CDIO3* and CDIOU25 and two CPEDI3* competitions. Fans will be pleased to know that their favorite "Friday Night Stars" Grand Prix Freestyle classes will return on Friday nights.



The Lövsta Future Challenge for young grand prix horses ages eight to ten years old will take place once again this year. The tour hosts five qualifiers in Wellington this year, and winners will earn a spot in the final during AGDF 11. The qualifiers are ridden in the Intermediate II test, while the final is ridden in the grand prix test for young horses. The total amount of prize money in the dressage tour is \$15,000.

The 2022 Lövsta Future Challenge winner, Jennifer Williams (USA), noted that the series is exciting and was a great experience for her and her horse, Joppe K.

"[We were able to] work toward those higher levels and get in front of those judges in a relatively low-pressure environment, versus a CDI," she said. "It gave me something really fun and exciting to shoot for, and I'm really grateful for the opportunity to get to showcase my youngster out there."

The 2022 season kicks off on January 11, with the first CDI-W competition, as well as CDI3* and national classes. AGDF 3 will follow (Jan. 25-29), welcoming CDI4*, CDI3*, CPEDI3*, and national competitors to the arenas at Equestrian Village. The circuit resumes for AGDF 5 (Feb. 8-12) and will host its second CDI-W of the year, a CDI3*, and continued national events in the rings adjoining the International Stadium. AGDF 6 (Feb 15-19) hosts national competition.

AGDF 7 (Feb. 22-26) promises a talented lineup, as competitors from all over the globe go head-to-head and country-to-country in the CDIO3* show along with CDIOU25 and CDI3* classes. The CDI-W and CDI3* and national levels promise another competitive week during AGDF 8 (Mar. 1-5), paired with the ever-popular Palm Beach Derby. AGDF's week 9 (Mar. 8-12) will welcome para dressage riders for their second CPEDI3* of the season, and international competition rises to the highest level on March 15 with AGDF 10, a CDI5*/ CDI3*/National show with all CDI5* classes held in the International Arena at Wellington International. The finale of the AGDF season includes week 11's CDI4* and CDI3*, and week 12 concludes with a national show. W

For U.S. athletes with aspirations to compete at the high-performance level, there is a long journey from competing at the national level to representing the U.S. at international championships. The US Equestrian (USEF) development pathways for each Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) discipline, supported by the USET Foundation, help bring promising athletes along each step of the way, ensuring the best opportunities for success. What's more, these pathway programs are key to building a robust pool of talent and therefore our country's

competitive equestrian excellence on the greatest international stages now and in the future.

In jumping, programs like the Platinum Performance/ USEF Show Jumping Talent Search Finals, the USEF Junior Jumper National Championships (Prix des States), FEI North American Youth Championships (NAYC), and the USEF Horsemastership Training Series prepare junior athletes for the higher levels, many of whom will compete at the Winter Equestrian Festival (WEF).

With the goal of helping athletes develop and hone skills needed to become an effective jumper athlete, Talent Search Finals is a jumper-style equitation competition composed of four phases: flatwork, gymnastics, jumping over a grand prix-style course that includes a water jump, and a rideoff where the top four competitors ride each of the other three top horses. USEF Junior Jumper National Championships (Prix des States) features both the Prix des States team competition, with teams fielded by zones, as well as an individual competition at the national level. NAYC provides competitors with a first step into international team experience and championship atmosphere and

and championship atmosphere and the annual USEF Horsemastership Training Series helps identify upcoming riders as potential future U.S. jumping team athletes while also providing them with an all-encompassing educational experience to promote their development.

There are three coaches that provide hands-on support for athletes participating in pathway programs: U.S. Jumping Youth Chef d'Equipe DiAnn Langer, U.S. Jumping Development Coach Anne Kursinski, and U.S. Jumping Chef d'Equipe and Technical Advisor Robert Ridland. Based on their experiences with the athletes and their indepth knowledge of the athletes' trajectories, the three coaches consistently work together to build teams that will successfully represent the U.S. in international competition.

This year, Langer and Ridland were onsite at the Talent Search Finals - West competition and discussed the purpose of the event as well as the caliber of the competitors and their potential.

"What makes Talent Search so special is that it's not just another equitation class," said Ridland. "It's a jumper class where the riders are judged. The time allowed and the open water, those are real issues when you get to the next level. I think we're in good stead with our future, and this was really exciting to watch."

"I'm always excited to see the top four and what they can accomplish," added Langer. "I think all of our riders [in this competition] are riders to keep an eye on for the future."

While it's not required that aspiring U.S. team riders participate in programs such as Talent Search, NAYC, and the Horsemastership Series, the programs do provide helpful steppingstones for athletes with their eyes on the greatest stages, particularly because U.S. athletes have less exposure to international competitions.

"We have great depth," Kursinski said of the up-and-coming jumping talent in the U.S., "but we don't have [easy access to] international experience like

the Europeans [do]. For us, getting riders to qualify [for NAYC] and getting that team experience under their belts is so important."

Athletes' progression onto the international stage is also part of the pathway. Athletes are selected to represent the U.S. to gain experience at the CSIO3* levels before moving up to the CSIO5* level. Simply getting overseas to compete against European teams is a crucial component of developing competitive team athletes.

The Team Experience

In November, the 2022 CSIO3* team led by Kursinski had an important outing in Europe competing at the FEI Jumping Nations Cup Vilamoura CSIO3* in Vilamoura, Portugal, ultimately capturing second place.

The team comprised of Kelly Arani and Impossible Dream, Cathleen Driscoll and Arome, Mimi Gochman and Celina BH, and Mavis Spencer and Carissimo 25, edged out 13 other teams to finish second behind the gold-medal team from France. Most of the athletes had competed as part of a team at the North American Youth Championships (NAYC) earlier in their careers, but this event offered them their second experience on a senior FEI Nations Cup team. These athletes had competed at the CSIO3* in Vejer de la Frontera, Spain, in October.

"They all put in great rounds," said Kursinski. "I think they've come a long way since Vejer [de la Frontera] getting that first one under their belts. They were all first-time three-star Nations Cup team members [at Vejer], so I think everybody was more relaxed and confident [at Vilamoura]. It was extremely competitive because there were 14 teams that got to compete, and you needed to fight to come back for the second round, so it was very tough competition."

Kursinski says that all of the team members have impressive results nationally at the grand prix level, and some have had team experience as young riders, but team outings like Vilamoura are a step up.


"There's just no substitute for this kind of experience," Kursinski explained. "When you're a team member, it's got a totally different feeling. If you're going first you've got to show the way [and] at the end you have that pressure of, 'Can you bring home another clear round?' You can only get that kind of team experience in the show ring."

"For athletes who want to get on a Wellington team or one of Robert Ridland's five-star teams, you've got to get your feet wet in these three-star Nations Cups" Kursinski continued. "The European experience is different. The warmup is different. Getting to the ring and starting is different. There are all these little things, and you can watch all the videos, but you have to come here and really experience it. So, if you want to get on the bigger teams, if you have those goals, these are really important for your experience."

The first jumping pathway program in 2023 will be the USEF Horsemastership Training Series running January 5-8 at Equestrian Village, home of the Adequan[®] Global Dressage Festival and WEF jumping events, in Wellington, Florida.







CALIFORNIA TRANSPLANT Ashlee Bond Calls Wellington Home



Ivmpian Ashlee Bond, who rides for the Israeli show jumping team, is in love with being a Floridian. Before settling in Wellington two years ago, Ashlee, a native Californian, kept her base on the West Coast while she competed at the Winter Equestrian Festival (WEF). But Ashlee, with her husband, Roy Meeus, and their daughter Scottie, has found where she wants to be.

"It's where everybody is," affirmed Ashlee. "You get to have the WEF and Global show grounds, and then other local places to show, other avenues that you just don't have elsewhere. I can be home, and my farm is there. I can almost walk to Global. It's the horse village of the country."

Within the top 100 riders in the world (Ashlee was 76th as of press time), she has found that competing in Wellington has raised her game. Ashlee explained, "WEF definitely prepares you better because you're competing against the best. You're with the top riders from around the world with their best horses and tons of prize money. The course designers are incredible. You have a Nations Cup, Saturday Night Lights, and there is something for everyone. I feel like it prepares you to do anything and win all over the world."

Winning all over the world is something that Ashlee is familiar with, notching victories in places like Argentina, Canada, France, Italy, Mexico, Russia, and Aachen, Germany. She has competed in four FEI World Cup™ Finals, the FEI World Equestrian Games, and rode in the 2021 Tokyo Olympic Games – where she finished 11th individually with Donatello 141, aka "Donnie" — and the 2022 FEI World Championships in Denmark.

Ashlee is also the reigning winner of the \$500,000 Rolex Grand Prix CSI5*, the highlight and largest event

of the season at WEF, which she captured in 2022 with Karoline of Ballmore, a horse she had only been riding for five weeks. While victory wasn't an expectation, it was validation of the program that Ashlee and her team had in place.

"I don't really set goals of 'I need to win this class.' When I enter a class, I enter because I feel like I have a good chance of winning, but I kind of just do my thing," she said. "Of course, everyone hopes one day they'll win a really prestigious grand prix. It was definitely unexpected because I had never jumped her in a fivestar grand prix.

"Donnie was just coming back from a really bad abscess," continued Ashlee. "I never had any expectation of jumping the course clear; it was more like, 'Hopefully it goes okay.' She played over it and ended up winning it, and it was just surreal."

The win gave Ashlee confidence, and while "Korra" has gone on to show under young rider Hallie Grimes,

Ashlee knows that the Rolex Grand Prix title is a special addition to her career.

Returning to the 2023 WEF, Ashlee will have Donnie at the top level as well as her new mount Garfield, owned by Aurora Farms LLC and Stal Horn. Additional FEI horses include Chill Ma and Elka de la Pomme, owned by Ilan Ferder, as well as her own Boheme de Fleyres. Another green eight-year-old and a homebred fiveyear-old will round out her winter string.

Ashlee will be prepping for the Israeli team's Olympic qualifier in Prague this July and wants to help her team qualify for the 2024 Paris Olympic Games.

"I'm definitely looking forward to hopefully going back to the Olympic Games and making Paris a much better experience for the team," she said. "Individually Tokyo was great, but we go because we want the team to do really well. I really hope that we can have strong combinations. We're as good as any of the other teams; we just don't have the depth of riders and horses. I know we definitely have a shot."

With Paris on the horizon, Ashlee looks forward to continuing her successful momentum as she spends time in Wellington competing at the Winter Equestrian Festival. W

Ashlee's Advice for Upcoming Professionals Have dreams of competing at the top levels of show jumping? Read on for tips from Ashlee Bond!




You can have the goal of being a professional, but there are so many steps to getting there. First, you need to have the proper education and find the right trainers and riders to learn from.

Watch the warm up areas — you can learn so much, more than in the show arena. See how the top riders warm up, flat their horse, how they train their horse. Know the base and education

and how to properly break a horse. You just have to get the hours in and learn the programs: how to keep horses sound, how to aim them for classes and shows. Go be a working student over in Europe. You can ride for a dealer. Be a groom. Mavis Spencer did it that way and look at her now. There are a lot of avenues. It can be easy to get stuck and think you know a lot. You go across the pond and you're like, 'Ok, now we're talking.' Europe is a great place, and it's not as expensive.

Set small goals so you don't overwhelm yourself. There are so many steps to get there. Start at a low level and work for who you think might be valuable to you at that moment, and then you can change and work for someone else who will add to your education. I've always felt that you can learn from everyone. You end up creating your own program. You take a little bit from different people.

"What started off as a national tour in dressage for U25 riders and young Grand Prix horses has now become one of the world's leading efforts in supporting young talents," said Antonia Ax:son Johnson, owner of Lövsta Stuteri and founder of Lövsta Future Challenge. "Our tours are spreading all over the world and this is now our fourth year in the U.S. We brought Lövsta Future Challenge to Wellington because Wellington has offered us – for over 10 years now – the most wonderful place to train and compete in a generous and hospitable environment. The qualifiers are ridden in Intermediate II, and the final is ridden in the Grand Prix test for young horses. The total amount of prize money for the dressage tour is \$15,000.
