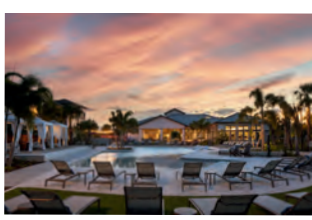

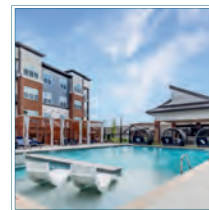

LISA ELLIS, CEO & CMO OF BRAINJUICE & BRAINJAVA

SPEAKS WITH WELLINGTON INTERNATIONAL ABOUT PURPOSE & VALUE IN A BUSINESS & WHY BRAINJUICE HAS INVESTED IN EQUESTRIAN SPORTS

Lisa Ellis has been a publicly recognized entertainment and music executive for almost three decades, has held consumer product marketing positions at Pepsi Cola and Reebok, and is founding Operating Partner at Fireman Capital Partners, a luxury consumer product private equity firm.

Lisa explained to us how she knew at an early age that she wanted to work in music, entertainment and sports. During her long tenure at Sony Music Entertainment and her sports marketing experience at Reebok, Ellis always combined consumer products with experiences as a part of her strategic planning.

Ellis shared with us how she feels her career began at fifteen-years old with teenage jobs at the HMV and Sam Goody Record store in the Columbia Mall. She recalls summers riding her bicycle to work in the office and backstage as a “runner” at the legendary Merriweather Post Amphitheater, where Ellis got to witness every concert from the side of the stage.

Growing up in Howard County, Maryland, which is horse country, and known also for Maryland Thoroughbred studding for the racing discipline, Lisa’s first horse was of course a rescued Maryland bred Thoroughbred named, “Hark The Angel Gabriel”. “To this day, the name Gabriel means so much to me because of my first horse,” shared Ellis.



Ellis says her earliest years as a lover of horses laid a base for her overall life that she was not fully aware of until she was an adult.

Equestrian sports are so different in comparison to many others. It involves a human and an animal. How did BRAINJUICE decide to dive fully committed into the sport, when there are so many other sport communities to market your products within?

“Our company is very young. BRAINJUICE markets to not only active individuals and those involved in sports, but to everyone that would like to naturally have focus, clarity, concentration, and for their brain to perform. Sports are a natural target for our marketing, but we also believe children, business executives, scholars/students, and a stay-at-home parent, need vitamins and minerals that support brain function. BRAINJUICE is now technically a decade old, but truly, it is five years young in operating in the real world of consumer brands.

Unlike most of the companies where I held executive leadership positions (Pepsi, Reebok, Sony Music Entertainment, Fireman Capital Partners, SoundCloud, LTD), a young company does not have a legacy or blueprint to follow.

This can take a young company down the wrong path, or it can provide the freedom to lead and be innovative. A young company must build value and purpose. The company’s reason for doing anything and everything, is building value. I say to our team very often that “our company begins with product development; it moves to product production, and it ends with product with the consumer. Everything else we do, needs to support those three things. Product, Product and Product.”

After that, purpose, values, marketing, and the brand become crystal clear. When you are authentic, the hard part is continuing to manage high level quality controls. When you are authentic, consumers believe. When you are authentic, you do not have to explain. You simply are what you are, and people get it because it hits an indescribable understanding and need for the consumer”.

Why did you feel Equestrian Sports fit your model for a brain health supplement? and wellness company?

I would like to say it is because the growing popularity of horses and the many Equestrian sports disciplines are on the rise. Particularly since the Covid-19 pandemic where many people became interested in riding and horse lifestyles. Selfishly, I have had horses since a young age growing up in Maryland. My business partner, Mark Willis, who is the majority shareholder of BRAINJUICE, is a Texan that also grew up riding and has horses in Texas. We love the animals and the diversity in the competition within Equestrian Sports has grown in awareness, competition, and lifestyle benefits. It just fits our personal passions.

We knew if we wanted to get involved in Equestrian sports, we had to be focused, intentional, and with a strategy. Not only for our brands values and purpose, but a strategy for the riders, professional community, and that the sport overall would respect our products because we approached it the right way. Meaning with the right intentions in serving the rider in his or her performance in concentration, clarity, focus, mood and in a natural product that is full of vitamins and minerals, beneficial to overall health.

Many Equestrian sport athletes, both amateurs and professionals, are embarking on building brands and businesses. How and what would you describe the most important realities you faced at BRAINJUICE?

Our company is young, and we began our “business at scale” a few years ago. The great part of this is we intentionally wanted to drive a new category of wellness and to be the leader in it. Consumers are wiser now, and seeking alternatives to pharmaceuticals and unhealthy products that have temporary effects, high levels of synthetics, high levels of sugar, preservatives, sodium and on and on.

We wanted to offer a product that is natural, vegan, glyphosate free, non-GMO, plant-based, low levels of natural sugar, and full of superfoods.

There is not a direct competitor that approaches product development like we do at BRAINJUICE. And now we have a natural collection of coffee and tea products, BRAINJAVA, which includes our same proprietary 'BrainPower Blend.' There are just no other products in the marketplace like ours. When you are a startup company, you make a million mistakes chasing trends, you have a lot of dreams, and at times you lack experience and the ability to be objective with yourself.

Most young companies are not brave enough to follow their own path. Do it alone. Be unique. Many young entrepreneurs are not able to connect the dream to how to actualize business goals, approach raising funding, and are commonly unable to be accountable to themselves or those that invest in them.

It takes courage to face pressure to grow and reach goals, and to be financially successful. Building a real brand and company is a long and hard climb, and a grind. Many business owners, including equestrians, refer to their companies as brands, but you are not a brand until you win, win again, then win again. This is like athletic competition success. You must convince a consumer that you matter to them and their needs, and until you deliver quality to them, it is not real.

Our founder and early team had very big dreams and big ideas. None of them are bad people, but big ideas and dreams are not enough to get it done. You must plan, strategize, re-plan, re-strategize, adjust, evaluate, and listen to a lot of people that tell you the truth you do not want to hear.

Our majority owner, Mark Willis was in a tough time in his life when he and I began working on business ventures together. During this time, his wife was diagnosed with breast cancer. He had a lot of other companies and business commitments that pulled him in multiple directions, but he believed in BRAINJUICE.

At that time, I also had my own film & television company (Provenance Media & Provenance Films), which I still own and operate, and was also the Global Head of Music at SoundCloud, and both of our time was at a bandwidth stretch.

Mark's wife, Cindy, unfortunately, lost her life only six months after her diagnosis, and on his terrace the evening after her memorial we decided to commit to building BRAINJUICE.

We both loved the earliest products the company had created which in 2019 was four of the 2.5 oz daily shots (we now have over 30 products including the new line of natural fortified coffees & teas for your brain health, BRAINJAVA).

Mark and I made a commitment to ourselves that we wanted to bring wellness to the world. On that night after he memorialized his late wife and seemed to have clarity in wanting to do something to help people and something that mattered. He was hurting deeply that evening, but I also knew he was serious, and so was I. The most important reality is that you really must believe in a purpose and value, and not something for vanity or ego, or because you are following what someone else has built.

How would you describe your company's business, purpose and values are supported by Equestrian Sports?

Little did we know that just as I had joined BRAINJUICE, that a once in a lifetime global pandemic would disrupt everyone's lives. COVID 19 happened, and the world began to unravel as we embarked on a goal that we gave ourselves in "bringing brain health to the world". I have had a home in Wellington, Florida for many years, and lived between New York and Los Angeles for two decades. During the initial weeks of COVID-19, as I was juggling three companies, one was accepting the position of CEO of BRAINJUICE, where I was to have a transition period. This changed all of that. I had to dive deep in. Made the difficult decision to immediately depart from SoundCloud, and I based myself in a work from home environment at my home in Wellington. It became the first time I was consistently at home in Wellington for months without leaving. This time gave me great clarity while I was challenged in making very tough decisions and building a future for the company.

I was accustomed to much larger corporate organizations and knew that this small young company was going to actually bring me some curve-balls I never saw before, as it had a lot of momentum that it was not prepared for. How do I reconstruct this brand, move forward with intention, hire a new team, build a new business plan, and correct and fix issues at the same time?

Product! Product! Product was our answer! Purpose! Values!

I had so many long internal conversations with myself on long trail rides through the canals, up to Grand Prix Village, through Palm Beach Point, and back to my barn. In many ways, Covid 19 helped me, and our team re-organized our start up, and challenged it to become a brand that is formidable and ready to bring brain health to the world! We soon began to catch a wave; we began to believe. Mostly, it was the first time where every early morning, I could get up and be outside in nature with my horses while the world was shutting down.

Equestrian sports were a perfect match with our values and purpose. It helped that we knew the professional and amateur sport community, but we do not do anything that is not 100% aligned. Equestrian Sports for us align on a long list of values and purposes for BRAINJUICE & BRAINJAVA.

Many brands try to be all things to all people. We intentionally do not specifically target equestrians in our product development. In fact, we target everyone with a brain.

However, Equestrian sports are a synchronized match to our values and purpose. When a company stays true to its purpose, and then aligns on values and commitment, it connects.

Equestrians by nature must be brave, bold, patient, concentrated, passionate, sensitive, and competitive. Yet, the sport is a global community that shares a passion. It is magical. We feel this matters. Moreover, it is truly exciting to sponsor and be a part of the elevation of all disciplines and bring excitement and support of the sports' growth with the undercurrent of health, wellness, and self-care. We hope that riders, participants in the sport, and the audience feel we are not marketing a brand, but that we are partnering with the community of equestrians and athletes (both human and horse) that not only entertain us in competition but bring joy and happiness.

3 Facts Veterinarians Wish You Knew about DJD

Get a better understanding of degenerative joint disease (DJD) and how you and your veterinarian can work together to help manage the disease in your horse.

Degenerative joint disease (DJD) is a major cause of equine lameness.¹ To help keep more horses moving, American Regent Animal Health, maker of Adequan® i.m. (polysulfated glycosaminoglycan), talked to a group of leading equine veterinarians. Here are their top insights about DJD.



1. DJD is an equal opportunity disease

Equine DJD, commonly called osteoarthritis, may cause lameness in horses of all ages and breeds. It is characterized by progressive deterioration of the articular cartilage along with changes in bone and soft tissues of the joint.¹

Veterinarians diagnose DJD, in part, by looking at radiographs. Dr. Kyla Ortved, the Jacques Jenny Endowed Term Chair of Orthopedic Surgery at the University of Pennsylvania's New Bolton Center, said she sees a lot of pre-purchase X-rays from people looking to buy young horses. for horses. "You're going to be able to [help] them. They're going to be successful at their job, and they're going to keep doing the job," Dr. Allen said. "And that's where I've focused my efforts on use of Adequan i.m. [polysulfated glycosaminoglycan], and I've found it very successful."

The historic results of the USEF Talent Search Finals reads like a who's who of past and present stars of jumping, including Andre Dignelli, Brianne Goutal, Richard Spooner, Lauren Hough, Lillie Keenan, Peter Lutz, Meredith Michaels-Berbaum, McLain Ward,

and many more.

The 2023 winner of the USEF Talent Search Finals – East, Luke Jensen, noted, “To be at the top of the level among your peers and to compete in a high-pressure situation is a great way to prepare yourself for future situations. As you come through as a junior and experience this fall season, it gives you the tools you need to begin dealing with pressure, which is very important because this sport is very mental. To be able to do this and continue to learn to deal with the pressure and the mindset has been super important.”

NAYC provides competitors with a first step into international team experience and championship atmosphere with four levels for athletes in Children's, Pre-Junior, Junior, and Young Rider divisions.

successful at NAYC, junior and young rider teams are chosen to represent the United States at the FEI Jumping Nations Cup® Youth Final. This year's teams competed in Belgium and brought home the team bronze in the junior division.

While it's not required that aspiring U.S. team riders participate in programs such as Talent Search, NAYC, and the Horsemastership Series, the programs do provide helpful steppingstones for athletes with their eyes on the greatest stages, particularly because U.S. athletes have less exposure to international competitions.

USEF has three coaches that provide one-on-one support for athletes in the pathway programs, including U.S. Jumping Youth Chef d'Equipe DiAnn Langer, U.S. Jumping Development Coach Anne Kursinski, and U.S. Jumping Chef d'Equipe and Technical Advisor Robert Ridland, and they are aided by Lizzy Chesson, Managing Director of Show Jumping, and Hallye Griffin, Director of FEI/High Performance Sport at USEF. Based on their experiences with the athletes and their in-depth

knowledge of the athletes' trajectories, the three coaches consistently work together to build teams that will successfully represent the U.S. in international competition.

"We have great depth," Kursinski said of the up-and-coming jumping talent in the U.S., "but we don't have [easy access to] international experience like the Europeans [do]. For us, getting riders to qualify [for NAYC] and getting that team experience under their belts is so important."

Developing Onto Teams

Athletes' progression onto the international stage is also part of the pathway. Athletes are selected to represent the U.S. to gain experience at the CSIO3* levels before moving up to the CSIO5* level. Simply getting overseas to compete against European teams is a crucial component of developing competitive team athletes.

A regular stop on the international calendar for developing teams are the Jumping Nations Cup

CSIO3* competitions in Vilamoura, Portugal, and Vejer de la Frontera, Spain.

Riders who have come up through pathway programs were fielded onto teams this year, including Zayna Rizvi, Caitlyn Connors, Hannah Selleck, and Jacob Pope.

Rizvi picked up individual gold medals in the Junior and Young Rider divisions in 2021 and 2022 at the FEI North American Youth Championships, while Jacob Pope was a team gold medalist in 2015 and Caitlyn Connors won team bronze in 2017. Team veteran Hannah Selleck was individual and team gold medalist in 2008, the same year she won the USEF Show Jumping Talent Search Finals – West. Pope won the East Finals in 2012.

Following a third-place podium finish, Kursinski

Galloping into Glory

Record-Breaking Economic Impact Sets Palm Beach County Abuzz

The Winter Equestrian Festival (WEF) stands as a testament to the grandeur and international appeal of equestrian sports. Held annually in Palm Beach County, Florida, the WEF is the world's largest equestrian competition, attracting athletes from over 34 countries and

all 50 U.S. states. This 13-week extravaganza has more than 34,00 horse entries and is sanctioned by both the United States Equestrian Federation (USEF) and the Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI), commences in early January and concludes in early April. Beyond the thrilling horse competitions, the WEF has another remarkable aspect – its substantial economic impact on Palm Beach County.

In 2023, two surveys were conducted to assess the WEF's economic influence. One survey targeted participants, including riders, owners, and trainers, while the other focused on spectators. The participant survey gathered data from 876 responses,

surpassing the target of 400, and the sample was reduced to 764 after excluding Palm Beach County residents. The spending data of nonresident participants, who contribute "new" money to the county, revealed impressive results.

Nonresident participants injected a staggering \$351.7 million into Palm Beach County's Gross Domestic Product (GDP) and supported 3,364 jobs. This contributed to labor earnings of \$103 million, with an average earnings per job of \$30,618.

A significant portion of this economic impact, \$262.5 million (74.6%), was attributed to direct horse-related expenditures, which averaged \$40,260 per horse. These direct expenditures stimulated additional economic activity within the county, resulting in over \$100 million in indirect expenditures.

The direct horse-related expenditures also generated labor earnings of \$78.3 million and created 2,690 jobs across various



industries in the local economy, with an average earnings per job of \$29,088.

Nonresident spectators, although attending only a fraction of the 12-week event, made a notable contribution. Their direct expenditures, totaling \$2.1 million during WEF 2023 Saturdays, boosted Palm Beach County's GDP by \$3.4 million, supporting 28 jobs and increasing labor earnings by approximately \$1 million. The average earnings per job for this segment were \$34,425.

The Winter Equestrian Festival (WEF) is not just a showcase of equestrian excellence but also a significant economic driver for Palm Beach County. In 2023, the WEF contributed



an astounding \$352 million to the county's GDP, supported thousands of jobs, and elevated labor earnings.

A majority of this economic impact is attributed to nonresident participants who, through their horse-related expenditures, bring substantial financial gains to the region. This impact

ripples through the local economy, benefitting a wide range of industries.

Nonresident spectators, while attending fewer days, also play a crucial role by contributing directly to the local economy and enhancing the overall experience of the WEF.

As the Winter Equestrian Festival continues to grow and evolve, it remains a shining example of how equestrian sports can not only captivate audiences but also provide a substantial economic boost to the host community. This annual equestrian extravaganza is not just a sporting event; it's an economic powerhouse that puts Palm Beach County on the global equestrian map.

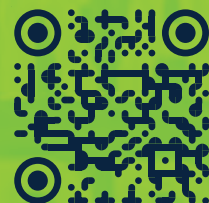

Rider Spotlight:

RICHARD VOGEL

Germany's Richard Vogel has found remarkable success in his career as a showjumper, competing at shows all over the world at the five-star level. Sitting 13th among the top 100 riders in the world, the name Vogel has become a familiar one across the globe.

Despite having spent only two seasons at Wellington International, Vogel has quickly become a standout among the best Winter Equestrian Festival (WEF) veterans, earning countless wins and making a name for himself on the international stage.

Vogel reigned victorious in the highlight and largest event of the season at WEF, the \$500,000 Rolex CSI5* Grand Prix, which he captured aboard nine-year-old Sportpferd gelding Cepano Baloubet, a horse he wasn't sure of even showing in such a famed grand prix.

While victory was not an expectation on a horse so new, it was validation that the new partnership would bring future successes.

"My plan was not to risk too much in the jump-off, but also to put the pressure on the ones coming after me so they had to risk a bit more to be faster and I was lucky it all worked out," said Vogel, who earned four international wins during the 2023 season at WEF.

Winning all over the world is something that Vogel is familiar with, notching victories in places like Canada, Spain, Belgium, Mexico, Germany, France, the United States, and

many other countries. Since his time at the 2023 Winter Season, Vogel has gone on to cinch wins at some of the most prestigious events such as the Longines FEI Barcelona Nations Cup, the Spruce Meadows 'Masters', the Longines FEI Jumping World Cup Final at Omaha, the Allianz-Prize at Aachen and many more.

We asked Vogel about his experience at the 2023 Winter Equestrian Festival!

How did you get into riding?

My mother's side of the family was always into horses. My uncle was a professional and truly a great horseman. My mom taught me all the basics when I was a child, but sadly passed away too early in life. When she passed, my uncle took over training me. He traveled all over the world competing so I would send him videos of my riding when he was away at shows, and we made it



work the best we could. My grandfather was also in the business of breeding horses, so it was easy for me to find horses in my life.

You've acquired an incredible string of horses that you have shown at WEF. What are the most important qualities in your horses?

A major part of our business is to educate young horses. We get a lot of young horses from owners and buy some ourselves with the goal of developing them to the top level. When I try horses and when I am working with the young ones, I look for horses with a strong, smart mind. What makes a great horse is their brain and what is in the interior.

Thinking back a few years, it was more about the physicality of the horse. We had a lot of very large, heavy, scopey horses.

Nowadays we are going towards smaller, more

intelligent horses that have the brain power to support their physical abilities.

We want horses that want to do the sport and that want to work with us. We all have different

types of bodies with similar capabilities, but what sets us apart is our mental capability.

You had an incredibly successful season at

WEF. What have been some of your favorite moments during the 2023 season?

A Saturday night classes are always something special here. The atmosphere it produces is something I've only experienced here in Wellington.

What has made this season so special are the people around me. I'm very honored and proud to have such great horse owners that are willing to trust me with such great partners here and in Europe. It's been quite the journey and none of it would be possible without the support, including my grooms who ensure the horses are in the best of care and are there for me at all times.

My job is on the back of a horse, practicing well enough to go into the ring and perform to the best of our ability, but besides that the rest of the credit goes to my team. They are what

allow us to come to places like Wellington and keep the horses in good health while doing so.

Actually, the main reason why we're here is Veronica Tracy. She's been training with us for three years; last year was our first season in Wellington. It was

Veronica's idea to come here and luckily, we made that happen. Wellington was very good to us sport-wise, but also business-wise.

Q What is a piece of advice you have for those wanting to rise to your level?

A The most important factor is to be hard working. See where you want to get in life, in this case where you want to be in the sport, and make a plan for it, see what you need to do to get there. In terms of working with horses, the

most important quality is patience. If you give a horse the time it needs, that time will pay off.

Sometimes the process will take double the amount of time you expected, especially when preparing a horse for the bigger classes, but they will always perform better that way instead of throwing them into something you're not ready for.

It's difficult balancing between wanting success and the willingness to put in the work it takes to get there. You cannot force your goals to happen in this sport.

US Equestrian Teams Keep Eyes on the Prize

The clock is ticking, the countdown started, and with each passing day, the Paris 2024 Summer Olympic and Paralympic Games becomes more of a reality for the US Equestrian staff and the teams who will head abroad in July of 2024, with the aim of bringing medals back to the United States.

With all four U.S. teams qualified for the summer Games, three Olympic teams and one Paralympic team, the U.S. contingent will be eyeing success, similar to 2021, which saw the U.S. Dressage Team, U.S.

Jumping Team, and U.S. Para Dressage Team all capture team medals.

Paris, the city of love and lights, will open its doors to the world from July 26 to September 8, 2024, showcasing 32 sports and

welcoming more than 10,000 athletes for the Olympic and Paralympic Games, with equestrian events taking place in the gardens of the iconic Château de Versailles, just an hour west of city central.

For the Sport Department at US Equestrian, plans have been in motion for more than four years, working through the challenges of Olympic and Paralympic logistics, horse flights, shipping and equipment manifests, transportation for staff and athletes, groom accommodations, and much more. Ensuring optimum field of play performance for competing combinations is the sole focus of U.S. team staff, providing athletes the ability to zone in and tune out distractions during the Games.





How It Works

Each of the four equestrian disciplines represented across the Games has a team and individual qualification process governed by the Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI), followed by an application and selection process overseen by US Equestrian for U.S. combinations. The team selection process includes input of the team's Chefs d'Equipe, team veterinarians and support staff, and others, and must be officially signed off by the US Equestrian Board of Directors and United States Olympic and Paralympic Committee (USOPC) prior to announcement.

"Like with every Olympic & Paralympic Games, there are many complexities with

the logistics around these types of championships, which ultimately impacts the scope and detail of our planning," said Hallye Griffin, USEF Director of FEI Sport.

"Since we are outside of Paris, in Versailles, it's about an hour to the Olympic Village, which means we have the element of planning and securing additional lodging, housing, and transportation. These Games will be challenging when it comes to security, transportation, and access, which is something we've been preparing for. The gardens where equestrian competitions will take place are within the Château grounds, but still significant walking distance from the palace itself, so looking through all

those details to understand how we can best support our staff, athletes, grooms, and owners are all items on our radar."

The disciplines of dressage, jumping, and para dressage all use a Short List as part of their selection methodology, which typically includes eight to ten horse-and-athlete combinations designated for potential team selection, all determined by a range of factors, including performance at identified Observation Events leading into the final selection period. The Olympic and Paralympic teams will be formally announced in late June to early July with the official entry deadline of the FEI and USOPC.

Competition Formats

Tokyo 2020 saw significant format changes for the three Olympic disciplines, with many of those changes still in place for Paris 2024, including a reduced number of team combinations from four to three for dressage, eventing, and jumping, meaning there is no available drop score for the teams, making every combination count towards the team total. This change has raised the stakes for all competitors, with the room for error marginal to earn a podium finish.

"We have a very condensed schedule this summer, which creates its own challenges in terms of how we manage the logistics around each of the teams," added Griffin. "In terms of the weather it

could be quite warm, and it could also be quite wet, hopefully it will be something in between. The weather can play a major role in terms of our approach to planning and how we can best prepare each of the disciplines for the potential circumstances they'll be competing in."

In a change to the Tokyo timetable, eventing will be the first equestrian discipline to compete at the grounds of Versailles and will operate in the same format as Tokyo 2020, with a team of three combinations contesting the three traditional phases of dressage, cross-country, and jumping. The competition will be held at the CCI5* level for dressage and jumping and CCI4* level for cross-country, hosted from July 26-29.

Team medals are determined by the lowest overall combined team scores following the jumping phase on Sunday. In a defining part of the championship format for eventing, a second round of jumping for the top 25 placed individual combinations following team competition, will ultimately crown three new individual medalists.

Dressage will move into the venue early in the week on July 26, starting with team medals determined

by the overall finish of the team's three combinations in the FEI Grand Prix Special, while individual medals will be contested for in the FEI Grand Prix Freestyle. The top 18 combinations from the Grand Prix will qualify to move forward to contest the freestyle in a bid for individual medals.

Concluding the equestrian portion of the Olympics will be jumping, which will see team competition lead off their week-long schedule, a significant change in the format from three years ago, which saw individual medals awarded before the start of team competition. Following two rounds to determine

team medals, three selected combinations will take on two additional rounds for the individual final.

Just under a month following the conclusion of the equestrian competition at the Olympics, the Paris 2024 Paralympics will begin, featuring combinations in five different Grades, I-V, with three combinations competing for the team and one individual combination representing the U.S. in three different tests – the FEI Para Dressage Team Test, FEI Para Dressage Individual Test, and FEI Para Dressage Freestyles.

"All of our preparations carry over to the Paralympics

as well. Our para team is equally as much of a focus for us as any of our Olympic teams. They had a great performance in Tokyo and have since continued to have success at many of our most recent championships. We're seeing the sport continue to grow and will make sure they are completely supported for the Paralympics too, since we know their aim is to replicate their championships results from the past two years," she added.

The Venue

When formally announced the gardens of Château de Versailles would



host the equestrian disciplines, both excitement and proactivity from national governing bodies ensued as the venue would pose some unusual logistical challenges as a deeply historic site with significant infrastructure buildout needs to accommodate world-class competition, but also usher in a fantastic opportunity to showcase the sport to a broader audience. The venue will include four arenas, including a covered training area, a gallop track, dedicated lunging arenas, while the main stadium will be built to seat nearly 10,000 spectators.

“The venue is an incredible setting for our sport, but also has provided significant demand in ticket acquisition, which has been challenging because there is such limited inventory available, which is a situation our sport hasn’t traditionally been in,” explained Griffin.

“From what has been communicated from the Organizing Committee, we’re expecting spectator capacity will be completely full, creating an incredible atmosphere for competition, but will simultaneously limit our ability to offer as many tickets as we are accustomed to from past Games.”

SCHEDULE & HOW TO WATCH

Building on the fanfare and engagement from Tokyo 2020 will be key for the United States as we look ahead to Paris 2024, as the Los Angeles 2028 Olympic and Paralympics Games are just right around the corner, bringing a home summer games back to the United States since Atlanta 1996. With a venue location as unique and iconic as the gardens of Versailles, equestrian competitions have already seen a significant uptick in demand for tickets and access from the public.

NBC will once again air primetime coverage across the United States, showcasing the variety of sporting competitions across the Games, also available live on their streaming platform, Peacock, with regular programming and broadcasts available on regular cable television. Currently, the timetable for the disciplines will be as follows, but is subject to change.

"What started off as a national tour in dressage

for U25 riders and young Grand Prix horses has now become one of the world's leading efforts in supporting young talents. Our tours are spreading all over the world and this is now our fifth year in the USA. We brought Lövsta Future Challenge to Wellington, because Wellington has offered us, for over 10 years now, the most wonderful place to come and train and compete and is generous and hospitable. So, we said we wanted to give something back," says Antonia Ax:son Johnson, owner Lövsta Stuteri and founder of Lövsta Future Challenge.

Lövsta Future Challenge was established in 2011 by Tinne Vilhelmson Silfven and Louise Nathorst with the support of Antonia Ax:son Johnson through Lövsta Stuteri. The project's stated mission: to help bring Sweden to

the forefront of equestrian sport and become a role model for other aspiring equestrian nations.

Lövsta Future Challenge Dressage — this year without entry fees

Lövsta Future Challenge Dressage – USA, the tour for young Grand Prix-horses is about to enter its fifth year. The tour hosts five qualifiers in Wellington, with first placed riders receiving a spot in the Finale during week 12. The qualifiers are ridden in Intermediate II, and the final is ridden in the Grand Prix for young horses. The total amount of prize money for the dressage tour is \$15,000.

New for this year is that Lövsta Future Challenge, together with the Global Dressage Festival, has removed the entry fees from the qualifiers, making yet another effort to support the team around the participants.

WEF 2024 continues Lövsta Future Challenge Jumping series

Lövsta Future Challenge Jumping is a development tour for seven-year-old horses with a vision to provide the best possible conditions for future stars in jumping. The tour will host seven qualifiers throughout the Winter Equestrian Festival circuit. At the end of the circuit, the qualified horses will compete in a prestigious final in the Wellington International Arena, with the total prize money of \$25,000 being offered.

"We were thrilled about the outcome of last year's season. With over 200 entries, from more than 15 nationalities, one could see how important it is to put our future stars into the spotlight. By giving them the opportunity to

compete in an arena like Wellington International, we hope to give them valuable experience for the future," says Sophie Mörner, founder of Lövsta Future Challenge Jumping US and fifth generation of the owner family.

From the beginning, Lövsta Future Challenge has focused on other aspects of competition development, including sustainability and more profound respect for horses through our philosophy of horsemanship. We share our beliefs and commitment in various forums in which we invite riders and their trainers from both dressage and jumping to participate in and learn.

Lövsta Future Challenge is about seeking knowledge and striving

for perfection, embracing the joy of the partnership between the horse and rider, and leaving a sustainable footprint within equestrian sport.

THE SPECTATOR'S GUIDE to Equestrian Competition

Show Jumping

Jumping is the best known and is also one of the three Olympic equestrian sports, along with Dressage and Eventing. The Olympic sport of Grand Prix show jumping is the highest and most challenging level of jumping competition. As in all equestrian sports, men and women compete as equals over a set course of obstacles that can be as tall as 1.60 meters (5.25 feet) in height. They must clear all the fences without knocking down a rail and within the time allowed to return for the second round, also known as the "jump-off," and be the fastest with the least faults to win.



Guide to Show Jumping Scoring

Penalties in show jumping competitions are referred to as "faults." Knocking down a rail or a pole on a jump is 4 faults, as is putting a foot in the water jump or the first refusal. In all jumper classes, falls and going off-course result in elimination, as does a second refusal.

Show Jumping Faults & Penalties

Knocking over a jump:	4 faults
Refusing a jump:	4 faults
Two refusals:	Eliminated
Rider falls off:	Eliminated
Over the time allowed:	1 fault for every second or portion thereof over the time allowed



Hunters

Hunt seat competitions are based upon elegant traditions arising from the foxhunt. Hunters differ from jumpers because they are judged on the style, movement, and technical proficiency of the horse and rider within the constraints of the set course design. Hunters should display jumping ability, manners, style, an even pace and quality.

A I feel as though the finals season is something we prepare for all year with the Maclay classes. I am so grateful to have had Chacco [Star] as my partner. He makes me so confident, and I really just love showing him, so coming out on top of the Maclay Finals just meant so much to me.

Q What are your expectations for the 2024 WEF Season? What are you looking forward to the most?

A I am most looking forward to starting my journey as a professional and I hope to step into the FEI ring as much as I can. I just want to get as much experience in the higher-level jumper ring as I can. 🐾

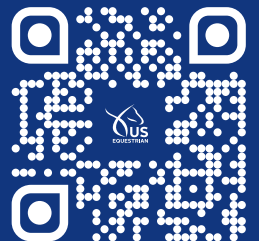

First discovered in 2005, the tiny, jewel-like Union Island gecko is found only on the island after which it is named, in St Vincent and the Grenadines. Plundered by the illegal pet trade, its population had plummeted by 80%. In 2016, the Forestry

Department approached Fauna & Flora for urgent assistance, following our success in rescuing other Caribbean reptiles from extinction. Working with local partners, Fauna & Flora has helped to protect the gecko and its fragile habitat through community-led patrols and surveillance to guard against poachers. Recent surveys showed an 80% increase in the population since our work began.

...To the massive

Our history of working to protect the iconic mountain gorillas of central Africa stretches back to the late 1970s when our now-Vice President, Sir David Attenborough, returned from filming *Life on Earth* and asked us to take urgent action to save this great ape from extinction.

Together with our partners, Fauna & Flora is ensuring the survival of mountain gorillas and their

forest habitat, through support for cross-border patrols, monitoring and law enforcement to stop poaching throughout the gorillas’ range, and by engaging local communities in their protection.

We also work with businesses to make sure that tourism in the area both benefits the local communi-ties and minimizes risk to the

priceless primates. Since that first intervention, mountain gorilla numbers have quadrupled to over 1,000 and it has been taken off the ‘red list’ of critically endangered species.

Saving Nature Together

Today Fauna & Flora has projects in 46 countries around the world, working with local communities to protect a total area of land

African elephants are facing an extinction crisis unlike anything seen before. It has even reached the point of poachers firing machine guns out of helicopters into entire herds.

These magnificent creatures, known for their remarkable intelligence, deep emotions, and strong family bonds, are hanging by a thread due to a devastating surge in poaching. Demand for ivory has exploded over the past decade, leading to the illegal killing of over 20,000 African elephants each year.

Their magnificent tusks are carved into mere trinkets - symbols of greed for those who value them over the precious lives of these majestic beings. We stand at a critical crossroads. Without immediate action to curb ivory demand and enforce strict regulations, poaching could devastate elephant populations beyond recovery.

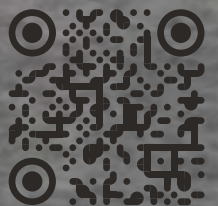

When asked about her favorite part of the job, Shelby's enthusiasm shines through. She expressed joy at being a special and





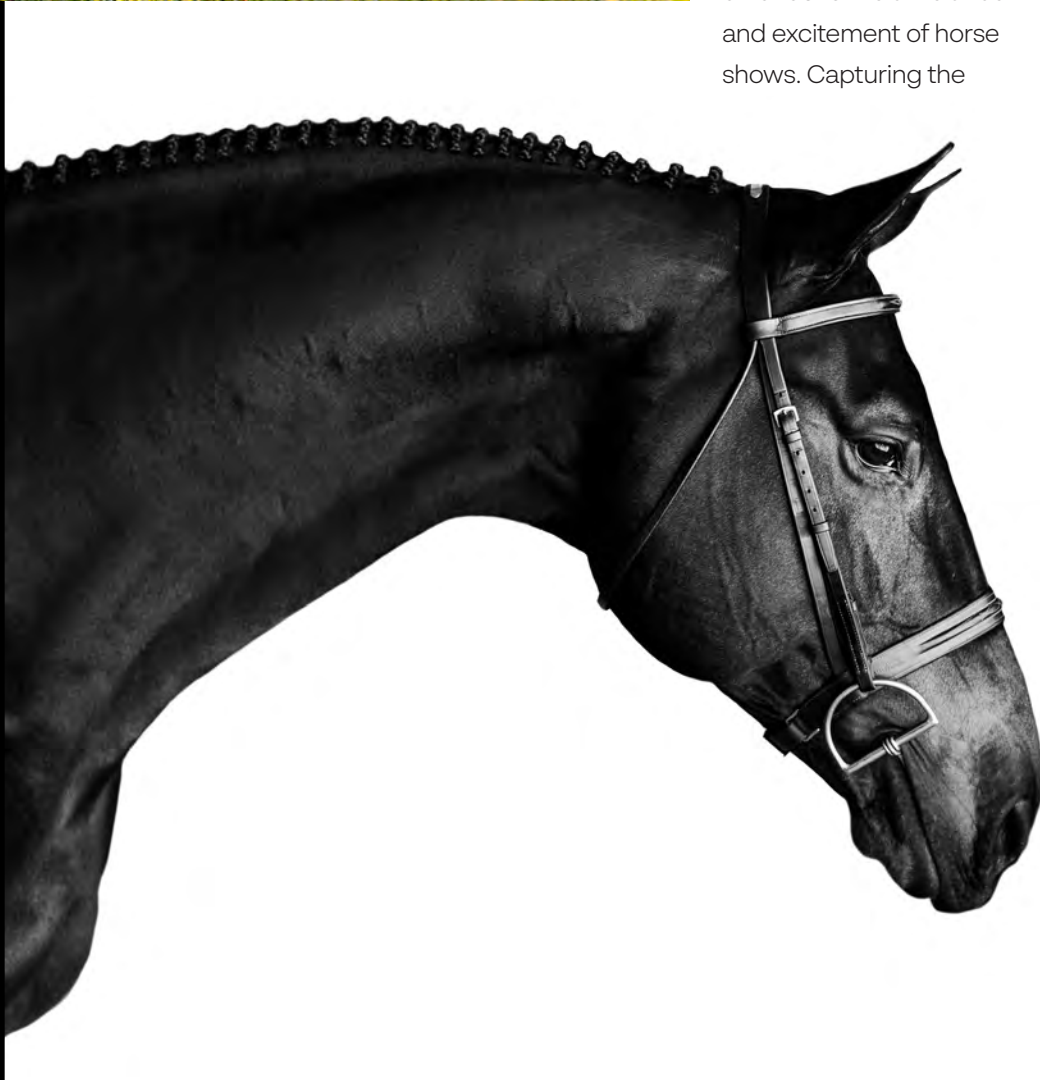

especially when Leibovitz captures Broadway casts. The artistry and storytelling in these photographs resonate deeply with Shelby's own vision.

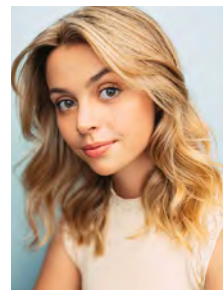
