



HERMÈS UNDER 25 GRAND PRIX SERIES

Summer Hill & Augusta Iwasaki are Leading Ladies in Hermès Under 25 Series Final

Rising talent soaked up the spotlight on the Sunday afternoon, the final day of Horseware Ireland sponsored WEF 10. Eighteen-year-old Augusta Iwasaki (USA) and Fresca topped the field in the \$50,000 Hermès Under 25 Grand Prix Series Final, while Summer Hill (USA) rode away with the series title on La Belle SCF.

The series standings experienced a shake-up as series leader Ashley Vogel (USA) had a miscommunication in the triple combination and ultimately chose to retire from the competition. Hill who has held second place in the series rankings leading up to the day, earned herself the last slot in the jump-off with her long-time partner La Belle SCF

In a nail-biting jump-off, Iwasaki, a Southern Methodist University (SMU) freshman managed to produce one of only two clear courses across both phases with Iwasaki & Reilly's 13-year-old KWPN mare (Carambole x BMC Nassau). Iwasaki is decidedly new to the Under 25 series making her debut in this 2023 season as she balances competition and attending school as part of the SMU Equestrian Team.

"It's been a really crazy time," Iwasaki explained as she gathered her things to head to the airport after the win. "I honestly don't know how everything just fell into place so perfectly, but she's an incredible horse and we trust each other. I am on spring break this week so my dad drove her down from Ocala and has been taking care of her for me; I can't thank him enough."

The match is a relatively new partnership but one that has been

Kent Farrington Finds New Star in Toulayna

Olympic team
Silver medalist
Kent Farrington has found yet
another leading lady in Toulayna
with a win in the \$226,000
Horseware Ireland CSI4* Grand
Prix under the glow of 'Saturday
Night Lights'. Befitting of St.
Patrick's Day week, the event
highlighted Week 10 of WEF.

Stepping up to the biggest test of her career to date, the nine-year-old Zangersheide mare could not be caught over the Andy Christiansen Jr. (USA) designed jump-off track and ticked the box for her first grand prix win. Nine horses advanced to the tie-breaking short course where the lead changed five times.

"This is definitely the biggest track she's jumped," said Farrington of the mare that was also third in the NetJets CSI4* Grand Prix during WEF 3. "I have high hopes for this horse. She's fast, careful and everything I like in a show jumper."

Farrington's Tokyo teammate

Jessica Springsteen set the pace as the first clear round aboard her Olympic mount Don Juan van de Donkhoeve for owner Stone Hill Farm. Their time of 39.58 seconds was soon eclipsed by fellow U.S. rider Lillie Keenan on Chansonette Farm's Agana van het Gerendal Z in 39.10 seconds.

Ireland's sole representative in the Horseware Ireland Grand Prix was Darragh Kenny in the irons of Amsterdam 27. They stole the lead from Keenan and stopped the clock at 38.94 seconds before Nicole Shahinian-Simpson took it back for the U.S. in 37.94 seconds. Farrington did just enough to seal the deal by stopping the timers at 37.38 seconds.

"I'm very confident on this horse and that's the way I like to do it; get them when they are young and produce them myself so I know them quite well," said Farrington, who has been with

defining for Iwasaki as she makes a name for herself in the jumper ring.

"I got this horse last summer from Roberto Teran, and I can't thank him enough because she's been amazing for me," she gushed. "Today's course was definitely technical, but I could tell as soon as I started jumping around the schooling area that she was ready."

While an unfortunate rail kept Hill and her own 12-year-old Belgian Warmblood mare (Diktator Van De Boslandhoeve x Baldini) from taking the class title, their fourth-place finish paired with a prolific season earned them the overall series winner award – a title she has been diligently working towards.

"This series has been a really good opportunity to step up in the FEI classes without competing against the big guys, so it's really a good steppingstone for sure,"

explained Hill. "It's a competitive group of horses and riders, and the course designers do a good job. It pushes you and gives the riders something to strive for, so I've really enjoyed it."

The 24-year-old rides professionally out of her family farm in Kentucky and works under the tutelage of Olympian Daniel Bluman (ISR). "I've been riding horses for Daniel for the past two years and just last season he started helping me full time," she explained. "He does as much as he can for me either in person or from afar, so that's been amazing."

As the overall series winner, Hill received a Hermès saddle, a \$10,000 Hermes store credit, and an invitation to a to-be-determined tour or show in Europe with equine flight expenses covered by the Dutta Corp. **U25 GRAND PRIX**

Toulayna since the mare's sevenyear-old year. "Even if they are green stepping up to this level, I know where I can take a shot."

Farrington has set high expectations for Toulayna. Ones that she is already meeting. "She's a very high strung horse

with a lot of blood and very sharp, but I try to keep the horses fresh and interested in the job because it's a long season here. She's done four weeks this season and I think that's plenty. We will hit the trails now and just chill out."







RIDER SPOTLIGHT: Joey Wölffer

Joey Wölffer, an equestrian, businesswoman and mother has proven that one can be competitive in the ring while juggling priorities outside of the barn.

Wölffer grew up riding on her family's farm and has transformed into an amateur rider currently competing at the two-star level. Outside of the ring, Wölffer helps run 'Wölffer Wine,' a company started by her father, that has become one of the most distinct rosé brands in the nation.

How did you get into riding?

When I was six years old my dad bought a one-hundred-acre potato farm in the Hamptons. My mom had ridden horses so that piqued my interest. I think I fell off every day as a kid, riding ponies in the field as they would reach down for a bite of grass after a jump. We slowly developed a backyard farm on our property, but I grew up with tough European parents who didn't believe in me

getting my own horse or pony. I ended up getting my own pony and training more seriously in the sport, but it wasn't until about 10 years ago when my father passed away that I got my own horse.

What has it been like to work in an industry that has historically been dominated by men?

My father started the business and when he passed away in 2008 it was handed over to my brother and me. Since then, my husband has taken the title of CEO and I have been in charge of brand strategy. Our approach had no expectations but big goals. Fast forward to today, I think Wölffer Wine has become its own brand and more than just a wine company. As a woman in the industry, I felt like the underdog, but that's what gave me the drive to grow the business to all we had dreamed of.

How have you been able to maintain your personal goals as a rider while juggling the rest of life?

I'm a person who likes to work off a schedule and have a routine, and with the lifestyle I've created, I have no choice but to stay organized. I know I am here to compete, so having that unvarying mental state and staying consistent in my riding helps me stay focused. When you're in the ring, you have to remind yourself to be calm, which is so important for me because outside of the show ring things often move at a very fast pace.

From a mental standpoint, I have had to learn to accept that I can't be everywhere at once and I must make adequate time for everything, including myself. Saying no to certain things is okay if that means I can have more time with my kids or time to rest. Proper balance happens when you can stay focused.

What do you think is the importance of growing up alongside these animals?

There is so much to be said about what this sport and what the



relationship with a horse can teach you. We are so privileged to be able to do this sport and be around these animals on a daily basis, which is something I want my kids to understand. There is nothing like the bond that is formed with a horse. My older daughter is naturally anxious and seeing her put her worries aside to go into a show ring will teach her so much in life. This sport and these animals teach you to be resilient, and I believe if you have resilience, you can do anything.


Wellington International Remembers

JOSE A DER, SR.

Jose A Der, Sr., founder of Der Dau, passed away on March 11 at the age of 95. He was a perfect example of the American dream.

Jose was born, son of Jose Der (of Lebanon) and Maria Dau (of Syria) who escaped to Cuba with their children after political conflicts in the region when he was a teenager. Jose ambitiously came to the United States without his family. He met and married his beautiful wife Maria Der. With Jose's years of experience in custom footwear, and Maria's ambitious drive, they started Der Dau, a small custom boot store on Flatbush Avenue, New York. Today, the Der Dau factory is located in the Gravesend area of Brooklyn. Jose and Maria traveled about 300 days of the year to "A-rated" equestrian competitions shaking hands with the best of the best in the equestrian world.

Jose Der, Sr. learned his craft in Cuba before moving to New York where the business thrives today under the leadership of his son, Joseph, the current CEO and Designer, known for his creative



designs. Today, Der Dau is one of the most respected names in equestrian sports for their manufacturing of custom boots, shoes and accessories for more than half a century. Der-Dau also specializes in luxury footwear for fashion-savvy celebrities and CEOs.

Jose Der was a large supporter of equestrian sports. He loved his business and building relationships with his customers. Every rider would feel privileged to sit on his custom throne to be fitted by Mr. Der for a pair of his custom boots that last forever. He was an expected fixture, centered at every major horse show in North America. He was a strong man who has devoted his entire life to his trade. He will be missed. There will never be another Jose Der.

EF has become "home" to thousands of horses and riders from all over the globe. The circuit offers the best of the best, from impeccable courses to the most competitive atmosphere one could hope for where Olympic athletes can be spotted around every corner. Every equestrian knows that behind every great horse and rider comes a groom, and to acknowledge these dedicated individuals, there was a \$4,000 groom's class offered on Friday of WEF 10.

The Double H Farm Grooms' Class had a solid turnout, including entries from both hunter and jumper divisions. For the class, grooms were asked to bring a 'show-ring ready,' fully tacked and booted horse to the ring. Grooms and their horses were judged on overall cleanliness, appropriate use and fit of tack, tack cleanliness, application of boots/ wraps, neatness of clipping, braiding job, overall presentation and their grooming box.

Hector Garcia, no stranger to this award after winning during Week 5, also won the Hunter section this week showcasing a horse named Hoopla, a 2009 Danish Warmblood gelding, owned by Louisa Attenborough and trained by Jennifer Hannan. Hannan, a top placing Hunter rider with wins throughout the circuit, had only wonderful things to say about Garcia. "The class means the world





to the guys, they all compete for it. They started to prepare the week before last, polishing up and getting ready. It does means so much to them, I think it really gives them a place to shine and have their spotlight."






